### Masonic Parking Lot Lines FYI

## **Operation Christmas**

**Child** is one of several projects sponsored by Samaritans Purse. First Presbyterian Church has been participating in this ministry for 18 years by packing shoeboxes and by serving as the Central Drop-Off Location for the Susquehanna Valley Area.

National Collection Week this year is November 12 - 19. Packing a simple shoebox for an underprivileged child someplace around the world is something I hope you will consider. If you would like information, it is available in the Church office. Choose a Boy or Girl from one of the three age levels: 2-4 years, 5-9 years and 10-14 years. Fill the shoe box with a stuffed animal, toys, school supplies and hygiene items. Enclose a donation of \$9 to help cover shipping and other costs. Give online through Follow Your Box and discover the destination of your shoebox. Return your box to the Church on Shoebox Sunday, November 18, or anytime during that week. Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift.

What a great way to share the love of Jesus with a child who may have never received a gift of any kind! Each box is distributed through church-based organizations. A Bible story booklet, "The Greatest Gift of All", is included in each box, translated into the child's own language.

Volunteers are needed to help folks who come here to drop off shoeboxes, to pack shoeboxes into cartons and to load the cartons into the trucks. Sign-up sheets are ready. I hope you will consider volunteering in some way – or perhaps you know someone who would like to help.

#### Guatemala Medical Mission Trip


#### January 19 – 27, 2019
