OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD 2018

Another National Collection Week is in the books and what a blessing that so many children around the world will be given the opportunity to hear about the love of God and be able to learn about Jesus. Each shoebox is a "Gospel Opportunity" that is distributed through churches in over 100 countries around the world. Each child that receives a box also receives a booklet in their own



language entitled, "The Greatest Gift of All", with colorful Bible stories.

The Susquehanna Valley Area had **21,125 shoeboxes** pass through the Central Drop-Off Location here at First Presbyterian Church. Four trailers were filled and a fifth came for the remaining 31 cartons that wouldn't fit. 6,633 shoeboxes were collected at the Lewisburg Drop-Off Location and 121 from our church.

Thank you to all who packed shoeboxes and to all who volunteered to make it happen. It was rewarding to have OCC Susquehanna Valley Area Year-Round Volunteers assisting this year: Dale and Glenna Rearick, Angela Bitting, Rebecca Imgrund and Dawn Harris. The Youth Groups from Oregon Hill Grace Chapel, Liberty, PA and Emmanuel Bible Fellowship in Sunbury were put to work. Also Meadowbrook Christian School's Girls Soccer Team and Student Council reps from Sunbury Christian Academy were greatly appreciated as volunteers.
