"4 Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant 5 or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; 6 it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. 7 Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." (I Corinthians 13:4-7, ESV)

You often hear this passage of the apostle Paul's letter to the church in Corinth read at weddings. And while these words are perfectly appropriate for a ceremony celebrating love, that's probably not the setting Paul imagined when he picked up his pen. The church in Corinth was a congregation facing significant obstacles, both from a hostile community around it, and from deep divides among its own members.

Looking at our world today, our situation here in Lewisburg as the end of 2020 fast approaches, I hear Paul's words as a challenge to aspire to. When faced with a world that doesn't agree with us, or a neighbor that doesn't understand our faith, or with a fellow brother or sister in Christ who stands on the opposite side of an important issue or question – what are we to do?

God calls us to respond with love.

Not just the emotion, mind you, that warm glow from our heart that makes everything feel light and easy. The love Paul describes is expressed through action; love is being patient, being kind, being humble. It is love expressed through self-restraint; reigning in our own wants and desires for someone else's sake. It is love that stands fast and burns strong, even in the face of long odds, unfair fights, and relentless criticism.

It is the same love that God himself demonstrated in Jesus Christ, who was patient, kind, and gentle -even unto death. When things are hard – and this year has offered more than

Worship from Home

At each meeting of the Session, we evaluate and reassess the precautions we're taking to reduce the spread of COVID-19. We are committed to maintaining as safe a facility as we can for those who want to worship in person, and will continue to provide a livestream broadcast and recorded version of our service for those who choose to stay at home.

You can access our worship services over the internet in several ways.

- 1. <u>Facebook:</u> At 10:30am on Sunday morning, you can participate from home by going to our church's Facebook page, @**Firstpresbylewisburg**. On Saturday evening, we post a link, and picture of the church, that will take you to a Youtube video. We start streaming live video from the sanctuary around 10:20am. If you visit our Facebook page anytime after Sunday morning, the link will take you to the stored Youtube video of that week's service.
- 2. <u>Website:</u> If you don't use Facebook, you can find the same Youtube link on our church website: https://first-presby.org. The scrolling header on our front page will have a headline, "Sunday's date 10:30am Worship Service and Livestream!" Click on the text of that headline and it will take you to a page where you will find more information about the service, and a picture of the church. The picture is a link to Youtube, from which you can watch the livestream on Sunday morning, or, anytime afterward, find the recording of the service.
- 3. <u>Youtube:</u> If you want to access our worship service directly from Youtube, go to youtube.com and search "First Presby Lewisburg." The search results will bring up my channel, Ryan Kraus. (There are other Ryan Kraus' out there be sure to look for "First Presbyterian Church of Lewisburg, PA" in the description!) Click "Ryan Kraus," and under the VIDEOS tab you'll find all the services we've recorded, starting with the most recent. You can subscribe to this channel to make it easier to find when you revisit youtube.com

A Note on Communion: For our in-person services in the sanctuary, we will continue celebrating the Lord's Supper using the prepackaged "fellowship cups." Any Sunday that we share this sacrament you are welcome to participate with bread and grape juice (or wine) which you already have at home. If you would prefer to share in the same elements that we're using here at church, we are glad to bring a supply of "fellowship cups" to you ahead of time. Please call the church office and let us know the best way to deliver them.

Volunteers Needed for National Collection Week

Once again, First Presbyterian Church will be a Drop-Off Location for the Susquehanna Valley region during Collection Week. Things will be a bit different this year as we will be conducting a "Curbside Drop-Off" focused on "no contact" whereby the donors will remain in their cars. As we implement the new process, we will be looking for volunteers to be Greeters/Hosts (they will be outside directing cars, collecting information from the donors and taking prayer requests), Shoebox Unloaders (they will be outdoors with carts, unloading shoeboxes from the donors' vehicles, stacking them on carts in easy to count stacks of 5 boxes, and pushing the carts inside the Church), and Shoebox Carton Packers (they will be inside the Church, will unload the shoeboxes from the cart, count and record the number of boxes, then pack the shoeboxes into cartons as time permits). Volunteers need to know that many of them will be outdoors in the weather (rain, snow or sunshine) and that it will be a more physically demanding role than in the past, as we take on the duty of transporting all boxes from the vehicles as they arrive. We will also be taking precautions such as having masks, gloves, and hand sanitizer available for volunteers.

"THE AWAKENING" – One Million Prayers For America THE HIMMELREICH LIBRARY LAUNCHES NATIONAL PROJECT TO CALL AMERICA'S CHRISTIANS TO PRAY FOR GOD TO "HEAL OUR LAND"

Thousands reached. National press stories. Inspiring prayers among Christians across America. First Presbyterian and The Himmelreich Memorial Library are serving as ground-zero for a new national outreach that launched from our church's campus in September.

"THE AWAKENING" seeks to lift One Million Prayers For America. *Pastor Ryan Kraus* is one of seven Prayer Leaders offering prayers through daily online videos every day since Labor Day. "The Awakening is inspired by the clear promise of God in the Bible," Pastor Ryan says, citing 2 Chronicles 7:14 as the basis for the online outreach:

"If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land."

- 2 Chronicles 7:14

Pastor Ryan offered the very first of "THE AWAKENING'S" ongoing online prayers right from the Reading Room of the Himmelreich – 55 days ago on September 8th. "Prayer unites us with God and with each other," he says. "God has given us the gift of prayer to bring healing where we are divided. The Awakening is simply an online gathering of Christians who take the promises of the Bible to heart – that as we turn back to God in repentance and prayer, He will heal our land, as He has promised. Our goal is to raise one million prayers for America."

Rev. Walt McCord of San Antonio, Texas – another of the project's online prayer leaders – agreed. "Just 50 prayer-partners in 50 churches in each of our 50 states praying daily can raise millions of prayers in just days," said McCord. "Given the power of online and social media networks to unite Christian believers together in prayer, our goal can be realized."

"The Awakening is not political," said Caroline Campagna, head librarian for The Himmelreich, the project's national sponsor. "We are simply a gathering of believers joining together to pray for God to heal America." The project is organizing now for the second wave of our online prayer outreach – and we wish to thank those who served as our "Awakening Prayer Leaders" during our first 8 weeks.
